

Trilateral command verbs in the Quran

Notice that the translations don't specify how many people are being commanded

وَإِذْ قُلْنَا **ادْخُلُوا** هَذِهِ الْقَرْيَةَ

And when We said: **Enter (masculine plural)** this city [2:58]

فَقُلْنَا **اضْرِبْ** بِعَصَاكَ الْحَجَرَ

We said: **Strike (masculine singular)** the rock with your staff [2:60]

وَأَنْصُرُوا آلِهَتَكُمْ إِنْ كُنْتُمْ فَاعِلِينَ

Help (masculine plural) your gods, if you are going to do (anything) [21:68]

قِيلَ لَهَا **ادْخُلِي** الصَّرْحَ

It was said to her: **Enter (feminine singular)** the palace

Example of 3rd person command verbs

Notice the the Lam of Amr takes a sukoon because it is preceded by a conjunction (فَ)

فَلْيَنْظُرِ الْإِنْسَانُ مِمَّ خُلِقَ

So let man **consider (masculine singular)** of what he is created:

The kasra at the end of the word **يَنْظُرِ** is actually a sukoon but for grammatical reasons has been changed into a kasra because of the word coming after it.
